



Listening Session Highlights

Mission Statement:

Encourage and promote excellence in sailing and social activities serving the Pine Lake Community

Objective:

To ensure that we are properly addressing the needs of our membership today, tomorrow, and into the future

Membership Feedback:

- What can we do to increase young adult participation (post X fleet) in our adult sailing program?
 (A) Obstacles to success:
 - 1. MC Boat is highly technical, designed for > 200lb., lack social connection (sail- alone) & mentorship, demographics supports > 55 years old audience
 - 2. E Boat is fun, but incredibly sophisticated and expensive, requires advanced skill-set, but very family & community centric
 - 3. Race schedule needs to be weekend centric
 - 4. Post X boat graduation has significant gap for average sailor
 - (B) Solutions to success:
 - 1. Option 1, MC: B fleet program (1-2 people < 35 years of age (MC can handle 200 lbs.), 6 races with mentorship-buddy system paired up with a fleet for assistance, coaching, etc.
 - 2. Option 2, Laser fleet: 16-35 years old, low price, with social activity afterwards (Pewaukee executes on Friday night) Social should be round-robin at target resident homes
 - 3. Option 3, E fleet mentorship program, possible B fleet (Similar to Lake Geneva Wednesday program)

 - (A)Winter social activities
 - 1. 2019 Hockey, broom-ball, chili-dump

PLYC ISLAND MAINTENANCE & IMPROVEMENTS REPORT 2018


This was a busy season for your Board and Island Committee. Several large projects were completed and enjoyed by all our membership:

- Phase I of the Shoreline Erosion Prevention Project (SEPP) addressed the most vulnerable part of the shoreline; the west side of island, from south pier to west pier.
- At the same time as the SEPP, the failing timber retaining wall was replaced with natural local stone boulders on both sides of fireplace. We also cleaned up the island by removing the old fuel tank from top of island and an old lift from south end.
- We also addressed erosion of the foot path with excavation and construction of a natural stone boulder retaining wall at north end of existing shed and to the south pier.
- We also started the long-term project of select removal of evasive plant species and dead wood in preparation for planting of replacement native plantings.
- Our new south pier was further enhanced with a jetty to organize the Sailing School boat lifts as well as the installation of a lift for the RC boat with an electric winch a feature enjoyed by all who serve on RC Design and contract work for west side pier extension and swim platform construction.
- The island was enhanced by the installation of the new west swim platform with direct access from the patio; made possible by the generous special donations from a group of members THANK YOU! This new feature was really appreciated by all and made it so much easier to host the holiday picnics & social events.

There are several items that are still in the planning stages, and we would encourage all members to express your opinions to any of the board members regarding the following:

- Install permanent posts with halyards and increase the number of sail shades over patio.
- Excavate and install drain tile behind shed to save foundation from additional damage. Replace doors on shed, repair interior walls/ceilings and paint exterior & interior.
- Remove and replace the failing roof of island shed and replace with new roof deck observation/sitting area, with new access to the top of the island via stairs or a switch back from the shed deck.
- Re-work electrical wiring and existing temporary party lighting to meet code. Wire back to new breaker panel in shed with hook-up for generator behind shed.
- Continue to look for an option for island toilet facilities to make extended visits to the island more enjoyable for all!

A special thanks to Lisa Maas for all her hard work on the island plantings and weekly cleaning of the island and to Mike Maas for his construction and maintenance of all the beautiful and solid piers!

Another busy year of sailing for our youth fleet this summer with the program starting the first week in June and running through Labor Day. Highlights in the Opti fleet include Henry Ackley 4th at Beulah Fun, 7th at GLSS, 14th at the Inland, and 5th at the Blue Chip. Jackson Horn won the Pram Power green fleet. Alyssa Neumann was 11 in the Opti Inland green fleet. Other regular regatta participants were Charlie and Grayson Bruss, Chris Horn, Alec Harned, and Trainor Rolfs. Finally, besides Henry qualifying for the Blue Chip, Grayson and Alyssa represented Pine Lake.

There were 11 X-boats this year highlighted by great sailing on the lake and dominating sailing in regattas. Suzanne Ackley was 2nd in the Trap, 5th Quad, 8th GLSS, 5th Extreme, 9th Inland Senior fleet and 10th at the Blue Chip. I am most impressed when the sailors follow these instructors as they sail in challenging conditions and around the regatta events. They are truly mentors for our sailors. The most memorable moment for me this summer was when the Winquist family hosted our team at their house during the Inland on Pewaukee. Each morning, the instructors had excellent chalk talk sessions talking about the plan for the day, local tips and tricks, reminders for speed, and a quick rule update to
